How Does a Sole Proprietorship Get Started?

- Starting a sole proprietor business is fairly simple. To start a sole proprietorship, all you need to do is:
 - Create a business name and decide on a location for your business
- File for a business license with your city or county, and get permission from your locality if you want to operate your business from home.
- Set up a business checking account so you don't mix up business and personal spending.
- In addition, your sole proprietorship may need to register with state entities (these registrations are the same for all types of businesses):
- if you plan to sell taxable products or services, you'll need to register with your state's taxing authority.
- if you plan to hire employees, you'll need to get an Employer Tax ID Number (Your bank may also require this tax number.)

What are the reasons why sole proprietorship businesses are popular?

sole proprietorship is the most flexible type of business because:

- The easiest form of business, as there are no complexities in handling or managing it
- Sole Proprietorships do not require mandatory registrations, thus making them easier to start
- Minimal investment required in the initial years
- 100% of the profit goes the owner
- Lesser legal compliances
- Lesser income tax
- Flexibility in operating the firm and decision making
- No specific audit requirement
